Article 32 – Zoning, Sections 7-402(b) and (c) and 7-403. Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000).

Critical Area Management Program Manual (2020 Edition), Sections 13.1 ("Buffer) and 13.1 ("Critical Area") (As enacted by Ordinance 20-374).

Background and Bill Summary

Ordinance 20-374, enacted in June 2020, revised various provisions of the Zoning Code governing the Critical Area Overlay Zoning District, adopted a new Critical Area Program Map, and adopted a new Critical Area Management Program Manual. This bill would amend sections 7-402(b) and (c) and 7-403 of the Zoning Code, as well as the new Critical Area Management Program Manual, to comply with a mandate of the Maryland Critical Area Commission to revise the definitions of "Buffer" and "Critical Area" and the provisions governing "Designation of the Critical Area."
