Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilman John Bullock opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives and read the bill into the record.
- 2. Councilmember Odette Ramos commented on the bill. She indicated that the bill was introduced to specifically address concerns about Baltimore and Gas Electric's (BGE) performance when performing maintenance and repair projects that impact City streets. She emphasized that the resolution outlined a number of specific issues that she would like BGE to respond to.
- 3. Liam Davis presented the Department of Transportation's report.
- 4. Committee members discussed the City's Envista portaluse, which flags potential conflicts for BGE, Department of Transportation and Department of Public Works repair projects. <u>The</u> <u>committee also discussed the need for better community notification about repair projects</u>. The committee also discussed:
 - Street cut repair violations
 - Compliance with Amercans with Disabilties Act (ADA) regulations
 - Citations for substandard street repair work
 - A means for reporting poor substandard street repair work
 - The number of City inspectors available to inspect street cuts
 - Use of regular versus emergency permitsby BGE to complete repairs
 - BGE's monitoring, evaluation and inspection of completed projects
 - Department of Transportation's new street cut policy
- 5. Faviola Donato-Galinda testified on behalf of Baltimore Gas and Electric. She detailed the process for BGE's work in the City and put forth suggested recommendations for improvements. She also emphasized that BGE will comply with all of the City's contractual obligations and ADA requirements.
- 6. A point was made that BGE does not conduct street repairs related to street lights. BGE makes marks on the street or sidewalk when it makes a cut, but the cuts are not related to street lights. BGE only conducts repairs related to gas and conduits. BGE's markings may appear near street lights, but BGE is not responsible for street lights
- 7. The committee heard public testimony.
- 8. The hearing was recessed.
