Analysis

Current Law

Public Law No: 117-2 (March 11, 2021)

American Rescue Plan Act of 2021: Summary: The U.S. House of Representatives on March 10, 2021, passed the Senate-amended H.R. 1319, the American Rescue Plan (ARP). The ARP provides \$1.9 trillion in additional relief to respond to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19). This follows the enactment of nearly \$4 trillion in COVID relief in 2020. President Joe Biden called for Congress to enact the ARP to provide relief for individuals and business struggling due to COVID-19, as well as to achieve other priorities of the Biden Administration and Congress. ARP includes provisions on aid to state and local governments, hard-hit industries and communities, tax changes affecting individuals and business, and other provisions.

The Ways and Means Committee held its last oversight hearing on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 16, 2021</u>.

 - Talked about processes, strategics, ideas, and etc.

 - Goal: To see a better Baltimore
- 2. Committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns, and made comments. Some highlighted topics of discussion and/or concern were:
 - Questions/Concerns/Comments
 - Makeup of the Non-Profit Panel/Board is it available? Answer: Yes, was already submitted
 - Concern: I would have preferred that the makeup of the panel be those who are not seeking funds; could be a conflict of interest
 - o Why not create an independent body? Answer: We are using alternate(s) to serve on the Board when there are conflicts of interest
 - When will the Dashboard (progress report) be available? Answer: It is contingent upon the time of the disbursement of the funds
 - Requested by President Mosby: Let us know when the dashboard is available so we can get it out to the public
 - How many non-profits have been scored to date? Answer: 28 out of 191 applications
 - Proposals: Were they unsolicited?
 - Was any guidance provided to agencies as to what is or is not available or eligible?
 - Suggestion: More outreach to agencies to provide more training on the proposal processes and eligibilities
 - Comment: Think there is some confusion within some agencies; need additional outreach. A high volume of proposals were denied
 - Glad to hear technical assistance will be available because the application process is hard
 - Similar Proposals
 - o How do you handle proposals received with similar ideas?
 - Talked about the importance of giving endorsements in a strategic way
 - Are you sending out another round of endorsements/information to us? Answer: Yes
 - Application Review: Is it on a first come first served basis? Answer: Yes
 - Public Safety How many applications been submitted for this?

- Housing, homelessness, rental assistance, etc.
 - o Have any discussion been made for funding for same? Answer: Yes
 - Have any funding been earmarked for same?
- Projects and/or Items that were already underfunded before COVID
 - o Can you talk a little more about this issue?
 - o Is of concern more funding is needed
- Concern: Staff and labor shortages due to COVID
- Some discussion regarding the 120 contact tracers
- Guidance to Agencies
 - o Comments: Part of this responsibility is on the City Administrator
 - o It is important to make the communication needed happen between agencies
 - o City Administrator should be at these meetings to share the work of his office. Answer: Per Chairman Costello, the City Administrator is not in attendance because of him but will make sure to have him or a representative attend future meetings if needed

Morgan State, UBalt to oversee \$641M in ARPA funds

The Mayor's Office announced a partnership with two Baltimore universities Dec. 14.

Morgan State University and University of Baltimore (UBalt) will be partnering with the Mayor's Office of Recovery to ensure the impactful, equitable and effective distribution of \$641 million the city received in American Rescue Plan (ARPA) funds for pandemic recovery.

Applicants could include but would not be limited business owners, hoteliers, restaurateurs,

retailers, and the like, as well as contractors building civil infrastructure, like highspeed internet.

UBalt will be focusing on infrastructure, broadband specifically. Morgan will be focusing on small business development.

"We've been tracking neighborhood data for 20 years," Professor Seema Iyer, associate director of the Jacob France Institute and research associate professor (UBalt) told the AFRO. "If a project wants to increase digital access in a particular neighborhood, we know a lot about that neighborhood already. I think that's one of the benefits of choosing us," Professor Iyer said. "We are really truly a partner in this because we've been tracking these things already. We're not starting from scratch."

"Our professors, whether they be on the entrepreneurship side, the finance side, the hospitality side, they are going to be getting access to data and research that not only will enrich and help educate the city, but it will give our faculty a lot more data and information to use for publishing," Nicholas Fletcher, assistant director, Masters Programs, Morgan State University, said.

Dr. David Wilson, president of Morgan State University, has made it Morgan's mission to achieve R1 research status, an educational benchmark that attracts and retains top-tier faculty and funding for research.

"This is a win-win," Mr. Fletcher said. "We're able to help the city, and as a university, also able to draw on an even stronger platform, gaining access to data and doing even more extensive research."

The AFRO will continue to monitor this story as it develops in the coming months.
