Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairman Stokes briefly talked about the purpose of the Oversight Hearing.
- 2. Director Perkins-Cohen introduced his team and talked about what is happening with Youth Works and other programs. Some highlights from his speech were:
 - Gave an overview of the Youth Works Program
 - Worksites availability and locations
 - Start date for Summer job program
 - 6,700 youth applied for jobs and all of them were given jobs (the Office have been able to say this for the past two (2) years, i.e. hired all who applied
 - Other programs available and all sessions are on UTube, included:
 - Youth Advisory Council
 - Financial Wednesday
 - Workforce Wednesday
 - Bright Future Fridays
 - Youth Works Academy
 - Mentorship Opportunities
 - Partnerships with Baltimore City Public Schools
 - The Learn and Earn Model
 - Talked about the upcoming Apprenticeship Job Fair
- 3. The committee members asked questions, made comments, and etc. Some highlighted topics of discussion were:
 - Requested by Chairman Stokes Please submit in writing details about all programs OED talked about today.
 - Requested by Councilmember Middleton Do you have a list of the number of youth workers each city agencies have hired? Please provide this list to committee members

Questions:

- The Youth Works Advisory Council can you talk more about this?
- During the application process were any rejected? Answer: I wouldn't like to say rejected but some applications were incomplete
- Guideline for worksites can you talk about this?
- Is it still a State requirement for youth workers to have a work permit? Answer: Yes, and is a barrier for some of the youth
- Is there a pathway available for youth workers getting employed by the city?
 - Answer:
 - Talked about the YH20 Program
 - Talked about the Office's partnership with DPW and how it ties in with some youth workers
 - A goal is to work with Recreation and Parks next with a similar program to include working with as many city agencies as possible
- The digital navigation system how are you using public dollars for this beyond summer jobs and into jobs beyond summer? (Year around youth employment) talk about this.
- Is there any support for child care?
- Are you helping people with expungements? Talk about this.

• What are you doing to help our juveniles?

Comment(s):

- Regarding the two (2) credits students need to get back in high school
- Concerns:
 - Transportation to Work Sites
 - Is concern about the youth workers in south Baltimore getting to and from their worksites
 - Are there any reduced fees for them getting to and from sites?
 - Answer: All workers will be able to get to and from work free as a result of a bill that was introduced by Senator McCray.
 - O Comment: Would like to see more fee reduction after the program is over
 - Response: A representative from OED talked about the "Let's Ride to Work Program that is offered through Lyft. The Program provides 43 rides per person within a four (4) week period.
 - City Residency
 - O Upper level management not living in the city is of concern
 - How are we thinking about growing our own municipal workforce, especially for upper management?
 - A strategic conversation is needed on this topic
 - Suggestion: To help cultivate employment what is the possibility of having evening street workers?
 - One goal would be help getting people out of gangs and/or out of that type of environment
 - Response: A representative from OED talked about the "Higher Up Program, a program that is for people 18 years and older; for those who are seeking immediate employment. She talked about their partnerships and stated the program is available through fiscal year 2026.
