Major Issues Discussed

- 1. The representative from the Baltimore City Public School System gave an overview of the proposed budget on May 26, 2022. *A copy of the presentation is on file*. Some highlights from the Presentation were:
 - Talked about schools' pillars and themes; Reconnect/Restore/Reimagine
 - Talked about federal funding and stated some of funding will be for one-time only spending
 - Finally getting back to some type of normalcy
 - Processes are moving much better now with virtual meetings
- 2. Committee/councilmember asked questions, made comments and etc. Some highlights of discussion and/or concern were:
 - Comments and concerns expressed regarding homeless students
 - Importance of financial literacy
 - o Comments regarding the enrichment of school clubs; the importance of partnership with state nationals (National Competition)
 - Safety conditions at some schools—are of concern
 - What is the budgeted amount for restorative practices? Answer: Per Doherty, will research and respond back
 - o Art in Schools Will some funding be spent on musical equipment? Answer: Yes
- 3. The May 26th hearing was called to recess and reconvened on June 2, 2022.
- 4. The chairman informed the attendees and listening audience about the purpose of the June 2, 2022 hearing; the representatives from BCPS is to give an evaluation of their fiscal year 2023 budget proposal.
- 5. The representative from the Board of School Commissioners gave opening remarks and talked briefly about some of the highlights of the budget proposal.
- 6. The CEO of BCPS introduced her staff and publicly expressed gratitude to all of her staff for their good work. She also stated, "There have been many challenges but we are committed to our young people."
- 7. A PowerPoint presentation was given by BCPS. A copy of the presentation is on file
- 8. The representative from the Department of Finance discussed the following topics:
 - * Maintenance of Efforts
 - * Nurse Program
 - * Crossing Guards
 - * Construction and Improvements
 - * 21st Century Schools
 - * Kirwin Contributions/Commitment

- 9. Committee/councilmember asked questions, made comments and etc. Some highlights of same were:
 - ARPA Funding
 - What is your allocation? Answer: \$443 million
 - What are your plans for this funding?
 - How much of the \$443 million is already committed?
 - Requested by Chairman Costello: Provide a spreadsheet displaying the breakdown of funding; to include expenses for same.
 - o Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC)
 - Requested by Chairman Costello: Provide a high-level update on the status of HVAC system throughout all schools
 - o Mental Health Support
 - Talk about spending and/or investment in this area.
 - Requested by Member Stokes: Provide a list of all the schools that have mental health support and the number of employees that have been hired for same.
 - Learning Lessons Forfeited/Lost During COVID
 - Talk about this
 - Homeless Students
 - Requested by Member Middleton: Provide a list of funding available for homeless students.
 - Disabled Students
 - How were disabled students handled during the pandemic? Talk about this.
 - o Increased substance abuse is of concern
 - Restorative Practices
 - How many schools are practicing restorative practices:
 - All of us are struggling with violence in the city; when will all schools have restorative practices?
 - Requested by Councilmember Cohen: Provide feedback on this topic within the next four weeks
 - o COVID Related Cases Within Council District 10 is of concern
 - Talk about:

 - Quarantine efforts within families
 - Quality Esurance Checks
