- 2. Brittney Spencer presented on the Health Department's overdose prevention program (presentation in file).
- 3. Adrienne Breidenstine presented on Behavioral Health System Baltimore's services and role in addressing the overdose crisis (presentation in file).
- 4. Lt. Col. Herzog discussed the Police Department's overdose response strategy, including directing victims to treatment and equipping officers with Naloxone and training.
- 5. James Matz summarized the Fire Department's work with the Health Department and its overdose prevention and response work.
- 6. Representatives from other agencies summarized the agencies' written reports.
- 7. Agency representatives responded to committee member questions.
- 8. Rajani Gudlavalleti from the Baltimore Harm Reduction Coalition presented on the Coalition's work and the benefits of overdose prevention sites (presentation in file).
- 9. The committee heard public testimony.
- 10. Chairwoman McCray explained that the committee would reconvene in the future and recessed the hearing.
