Resident Demographics

Population Landscape:

❖ Baltimore City: 135,356 women 15-44 yrs 30% NH White 6% Hispanic 60% NH Black 4% NH Other

Abortion Prevalence:

- ❖ US: 13.5 abortions per 1000 women
- Maryland: 25.0 abortions per 1000 women
- Baltimore City: estimated between 975-2388* of pregnancies end in abortion

Abortion Services:

- Maryland: 44 clinics statewide
- Baltimore City: 2 clinics in city & 3 clinics in neighboring counties

BCHD Current Clinical Role

- Title X Provider
 - 2 Clinics Eastside and Westside
- Reproductive Health Services
 - Contraception (birth control) including IUDs and subdermal implant (Nexplanon)
 - Emergency contraception
 - Pregnancy testing and referrals
 - Breast exams for ages 20+
 - Pap test (cervical cancer screening) for ages21+
 - STD screening and treatment
 - HIV testing and counseling
 - Substance use and mental health screenings and referrals
 - Individual, group, and family counseling
 - Health education and outreach
- Referral Source to Abortion Providers

- In addition to providing the aforementioned services, BCHD funds the following Title X providers in the City:
 - BCHD's School Health
 - BCHD's Needle Exchange Program
 - Baltimore Medical Systems
 - Johns Hopkins- Harriet Lane Adolescent Clinic
 - University of Maryland –
 Adolescent and Young Adult
 Center
 - Johns Hopkins-Rales
 School-based Health Center





BCHD Planning and Preparation: post-Roe

- Met with State and held several individual partner meetings with other abortion providers
- Developed preliminary profile of service location and utilization
- Developed a one-pager outlining the current situation
- Updated resources on website
- Refreshed five-year Youth Sexual Health Strategy in support of Reproductive Justice
- Continue to monitor the Abortion Care Access Act and training for new service providers





Next Steps

- Ensure Title X services continue to operate optimally
- Restart youth sexual health monthly coalition with refreshed strategy
- Coordinate with the State on the Abortion Clinical Care Training Program
- Review current referral processes to close any identified gaps
- Continue to ensure providers, city residents, and City agencies understand Maryland's abortion laws
- With our partners, continue to clarify abortion care service utilization and projection of need for services in Baltimore City (residents or out of state currently, etc.)
- Continue to focus on the larger picture of maternal health, ensuring abortion care services is understood within this larger context of need





Filling Gaps in Reproductive Health Services

- Implement refreshed youth sexual health strategy to establish a reproductive justice framework
- Ensure family planning services across the city are equitably distributed
- Expand and implement evidence-informed sexual health education to students in collaboration with City Schools
- Seek additional funding for B'more for Healthy Babies and Youth Sexual Health Strategy (UCHOOSE-Know What U Want) for protection of optimal maternal health in the preconception and postpartum periods (for teens and for adults)
