### **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Councilmember Sharon Green Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives and read the bill into the record.
- 2. The committee discussed proposed amendments to the bill.
- 3. Councilmembers Dorsey, Ramos and Conway submitted amendments.
- Table 10-401 (Commercial District Bulk and Yard Regulations C1-C4). Councilmember
  Dorsey indicated that his proposed Amendment No. 3 adds language to the bill on page 56
  pertaining to maximum building heights.
- 5. <u>Title 2-203 Transition rules.</u> Councilmember Conway indicated that his proposed Amendment 1 strikes language in the bill and adds new language on page 8 pertaining to transition rules for altering previously authorized permitted and conditional uses.
- 6. <u>Title 16-601(1) Required Off-street parking.</u> Councilmember Ramos withdrew a proposed amendment for this section pertaining to provisions for parking space requirements for multifamily dwellings.
- 7. <u>Title 2-202 Exempt utility and governmental uses</u> Tamara Wood testified that after discussions, there was agreement to support Councilmember Dorsey's Amendment 1. The Planning Department's amendment has been revised to add a new section to exempt certain equipment, installations and structures located on public property that may be used by a government entity for internet or telecommunications.
- 8. <u>Title 5-406 Approval standards.</u> Tamara Wood explained the Planning Department's amendments for both sections 5-406 (a) and (b). The Planning Department's amendments for this section received a favorable vote.
- 9. <u>Title 14-314 Text and Tables related to Gas (Fuel) Stations</u>— The Planning Department's amendments for this section received a favorable vote.
- 10. <u>Title 15-504 Carriage houses</u> Councilmember Ramos' amendment for this section received a favorable vote.
- 11. <u>Title 16-601(f) Parking Exemption for Historic Structures</u> Tamara Wood explained how the Planning Department's amendment clarifies language related to exemptions in this section. The Planning Department's amendment received a <u>favorable vote</u>.
- 12. <u>Title 18-206 Determination of Non-conformity</u> The Planning Department's amendment for this section received a <u>favorable</u> vote.
- 13. <u>Titles 18-0207 & 18-0306, Table 7-202</u> The committee discussed amendments for these sections. No vote was taken.
- 14. <u>Gas (Fuel) Stations language in Tables 10-301, 11-301, 12-302and 16-406</u> Planning Department amendments related to gas (fuel) stations received a <u>favorable</u> vote.
- 15. The hearing was recessed.
