Major Issues Discussed

- 1. The representative from BCPS gave a PowerPoint presentation. A copy is on file. The Presentation included the following topics:
 - Fiscal Year 2022 General Fund Revenues as of June 30, 2022
 - Fiscal Year 2022 General Fund Expenditures as of June 30, 2022
 - Fiscal Year 2022 Summary of GF Revenue and Expenditures as of June 30, 2022
- 2. Committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns and made comments. Some highlighted topics of discussion and/or concern were:
 - Behavioral Health Services
 - Committee member McCray stated that she is concerned about the behavioral health services that are provided in schools in the Frankford Area of the City; services relating to:
 - Trauma
 - Mental Health
 - Uptick in Youth Violence
 - Requested by member McCray: Submit in writing, what the BCPSS is spending on behavioral health.
 - Requested by member Stokes Provide the above data for all BCPS(s).
 - Per Mr. Doherty, he will gather the information relating to behavioral health services provided in schools and submit same to committee.
 - COVID/Pandemic Backlash Associated with Same
 - What have the BCPSS done to help students with their academics? To getting them back to standards! What are some of your plans for same?
 - Some answers given were:
 - Extended School Days
 - Summer Programs, and
 - Homegrown Tutoring Programs
 - Teacher Shortages
 - A representative from the BCPSS talked about the staffing shortages.
 Some comments were:
 - o Teacher shortage is a national problem
 - o The BCPSS had approximately 1,300 vacancies this school year; up from 600 vacancies to 1,300!
 - o But have hired 700 more teaches this year; but it is not enough!
 - Day Care in BCPS
 - A committee member commented, "day care is important for students who are parents!" Where is BCPS on this issue?
 - Response given: Day Care is in some of the school buildings but BCPS does not run them!
 - Older School Buildings
 - Are you looking at all school buildings to see which ones may need additional funding?
 - Partnerships
 - <u>Suggestion</u>: BCPS should reach out to some of the organizations within the City for partnerships, such as the Family League.
