INTEGRATED SERVICES

CARE COORDINATION

- Individualized case management and goalsetting to address barriers to independence
- Basic needs: housing, benefits, tangible needs
- Wraparound services: education, employment, legal assistance, health care ...

MENTORING

- One-to-one mentoring using evidence-based national standards
- Needs-based advocacy

TRAUMA THERAPY

Intensive therapy at no cost to survivors

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

- Educational support
- Job readiness and training
- Financial inclusion (financial literacy, bank access)
- Life coaching (finances and employment)
- Stable long-term housing

CLIENT PROFILE (2022)

JURISDICTION

 69% meet Baltimore City Regional Navigator criteria

AGE AT INITIAL ENROLLMENT

- 67% under age 18
- 27% ages 18-24
- 6% over 24 (victimized as children)

ETHNICITY

- 88% Black or African American
- 9% White
- 3% Hispanic or Latina

VICTIMIZATION

- 41% confirmed child sex trafficking survivors
- 41% highly suspected of experiencing CST but may not self-identify
- 18% at high risk of experiencing trafficking due to other forms of abuse, neglect, or trafficking of siblings

2022 SNAPSHOT

- 33 Survivors and youth at risk received tailored clinical and support services
- 1 Dependent children of survivors received direct and indirect support
- 100+ Hours in multi-disciplinary collaboration to ensure coordinated, integrated care
- **500+** Hours volunteers invested in direct survivor care through mentoring and advocacy
- 1.000+ Youth and adults educated about the realities of human trafficking
