## **Purpose:**

For the purpose of designating the Truck House No. 5 (Oliver Community Firehouse), 1220 E. Oliver St., as an historical landmark: exterior.

**Effective:** The 30<sup>th</sup> day after enactment.

## **Analysis**

### **Current Law**

Baltimore City Code; Article 6 – Historical and Architectural Preservation; Subtitle 18A-2 – Designation of Landmarks

In general, an ordinance of the Mayor and City Council is required to:

- (1) add a structure and its appurtenant property to the Landmark List: Exteriors or the Landmark List: Public Interiors; or
- (2) for a structure already on the Landmark List: Exteriors, to modify the boundaries of the appurtenant land or other property that is included in the Landmark designation.

Recommendations from the Commission on Historical and Architectural Preservation and the Planning Commission must be submitted to the Council before the bill is placed on second reading calendar.

## **Background**

Bill 21-0158 proposes to designate as a historical landmark the structure known as Truck House No. 5 (Oliver Community Firehouse) which is at 1220 East Oliver Street. The firehouse, located in the Oliver Community, is situated at the intersection of Oliver Street and Harford Road.

Built in 1905, the brick firehouse is one of the last ones constructed for horse drawn fire trucks. The firehouse served the Oliver community for over 110 years.
