Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Implementation of Weekly Recycling: The Department of Public Works (DPW) discussed its plans to implement weekly recycling starting in the first part of 2024. They expressed gratitude for the support received from the Mayor and his administration, including additional staff and the procurement of trucks.
- 2. Projects at Ashburn and Druid Lake Reservoirs: Updates were provided on ongoing projects at Ashburn and Druid Lake Reservoirs. These projects were slated for completion, with Ashburn expected to be finished by the end of November and Druid Lake by the end of December.
- 3. Consent Decree with MDE and Bluewater Baltimore: DPW negotiated a consent decree with the Maryland Department of Environment (MDE) and Bluewater Baltimore regarding the wastewater treatment plants. This consent decree was scheduled for approval at the Board of Estimates and court approval. Compliance with the consent decree was recognized as a significant achievement.
- 4. Staffing Levels: The Chief Administrative Officer discussed the overall vacancy rate for the DPW, focusing on staffing levels in the Solid Waste and Water/Wastewater Bureaus. Efforts to fill these vacancies, particularly those related to weekly recycling and CDL2 positions, were addressed.
- 5. Water Billing and Promise Pay: DPW provided updates on the Water for All program, including the number of approved homeowners and tenants, the total approved dollars, and the number of applications by ZIP code and council districts. They also discussed the Promise Pay program for delinquent water bill payment plans.

- 1. Councilmember Torrance expressed concerns about the Office of Engineering and Construction within DPW and requested a formal oversight hearing specifically for this office. He raised issues related to staffing, safety violations, and inefficiencies in projects. He requested that the leadership team of this office and inspectors be present at the hearing.
- 2. Councilman Conway requested accountability for contractors to ensure quality work and maintenance after projects are completed.
- 3. Councilman Schleifer requested information on the resumption of weekly recycling and a timeline for sharing all correspondence regarding the deliberation on restarting weekly recycling.
- 4. Councilwoman Porter requested a Standard Operating Procedure for contract management and project timelines, focusing on major projects spanning more than one year.
- 5. Councilman Torrence requested information on amending the bids to score contractors based on past performance and failures.
- Councilman Schleifer requested an Excel spreadsheet detailing the counts of different size water meters per Council District.

- 7. Councilman Schleifer asked about the status of procuring smaller street sweeping trucks for bike lanes and coordination between DOT and DPW.
- 8. Councilman Schleifer inquired about the purpose and assignments of Dr. Mitchell, the previous director and requested to review his contract.
