28 29	(2) THE NUMBER OF VEHICLES SEIZED AND FORFEITED IN THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR UNDER PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE;	

1	(3) ANY GRANT AWARDS MADE IN THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR UNDER § 7-627
2	{"Grants for reports of violations"} of this subtitle;
3	(4) THE NUMBER OF VIOLATIONS ISSUED IN THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR,
4	DISAGGREGATED BY ZIP CODE; AND
5	(5)-ANY LEGISLATIVE OR ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR BETTER
6	COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT WITH THIS SUBTITLE.
7	(B) AGENCY COOPERATION.
8	AT THE REQUEST OF THE COMMISSIONER, ALL CITY OFFICIALS AND AGENCIES SHALL
9	COOPERATE WITH THE COMMISSIONER IN COMPILING THE DATA REQUIRED BY THIS
10	SECTION.
11	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
12	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
13	Ordinance.
14	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day
15	after the date it is enacted.
