Background

The Office of the City Administrator has been requested to review City Council Bill # 21-0107, Study and Report - Operations of the Baltimore City Fire Department. The Office of the City Administrator is generally supportive of analytical products aimed at improving the productivity and service delivery of our agencies.

The report as requested by the proposed legislation requires extensive unfunded research, analysis, and writing all to be completed within 180 days of enactment. As outlined in the bill report from the Baltimore City Fire Department, there are several logistical, resource, and labor challenges with completing the requested reports. The Office of the City Administrator will work with the Baltimore City Fire Department and the City Council to report out with any analysis that is available that meets the requests.

Conclusion
