### **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Councilwoman Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives. She read the bill into the record.
- 2. Councilmember Bullock explained the purpose of the bill.
- 3. Angela Alvarez testified that a standard process was followed to seek input on naming the school program. The Baltimore City Board of Public Schools Commissioners approved the name (Billie Holiday) for the school program which was nominated as a result of the naming process. She emphasized that there is a distinct difference between naming a building and naming a school program. Sometimes a school will have a different name than the building. The name Billie Holiday is currently connected to the school program. Approval of Bill 21-0108 will rename the building to Billie Holiday.
- 4. Denisha Logan testified in support of the bill emphasizing that the school program focuses on arts inspirations using dance, music and other creative art forms. Billie Holidays' used her art form to entertain and as an activist.
- 5. Agency representatives testified on behalf of their respective agencies.
- 6. The committee voted to recommend the bill favorably.
- 7. The hearing was adjourned.
