The Department of General Services (DGS) is in receipt of and reporting herein on City Council Bill 21-0114: Building, Fire, and Related Codes – Vacant Building Receivers – Failure to Sell.

## **Background**

This bill would ensure that a receiver appointed to sell a vacant building may offer the property for sale to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City, if the property fails to sell at public auction.

## **Fiscal Impact**

DGS does not expect any fiscal impact for the agency, associated with the identified bill.

Per the Charter, DGS is tasked with managing City-owned properties that are necessary for City operations and service delivery. We do not acquire properties for any other purpose and do not act as an agent for the sale or transfer of property. We have no mechanism to, or interest in, receiving or managing properties that are residential, retail, or land-only parcels. Bill 21-0114 would have no adverse or other effects on DGS operations.

For the reasons identified above, the Department of General Services does not oppose City Council Bill 21-0114.
