A Bill Entitled

An Ordinance concerning  
**Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation - Department of General Services - \$675,000**  
For the purpose of providing a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$675,000.00 to the Department of General Services - Service 734 (Capital Projects Division), to provide funding for Fiscal Year 2022 expenses; and providing for a special effective date.

**Recitals**

The revenue appropriated by this Ordinance represents funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in excess of the revenue relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2022.

This additional revenue could not have been reasonably anticipated when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2022 was formulated.

This appropriation is made necessary by a material change in circumstances since the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2022 was formulated or is for a new program that could not have been reasonably anticipated when that Ordinance of Estimates was formulated.

On October 19, 2022, the Board of Estimates recommended this appropriation to the City Council.

**Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,** That \$675,000.00 shall be made available to the Department of General Services - Service 734 (Capital Projects Division) as a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation for Fiscal Year 2022, to provide funding for Fiscal Year 2022 expenses. The source of revenue for this appropriation are funds from FEMA in excess of the amount from this source that was relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for

Fiscal Year 2022.

**Section 2. And be it further ordained,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
