20	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
21	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

1	§ 22-5. Composition.
2	(a) In general.
3	The Commission comprises 17 [voting] members [and 14 non-voting members].
4	(b) [Voting members] MEMBERS.
5 6	(1) The [voting] members shall be appointed by the Mayor, in accordance with City Charter Article IV, § 6, as follows:
7 8	(i) 1 youth from each of the 14 Council Districts, at least 1 of whom is not a graduate of or then enrolled in a traditional educational program; and
9	(ii) 3 at-large youths recommended by the President of the City Council.
10	(2) Each [voting] member of the Commission must be a resident of Baltimore City.
11	(3) A youth may not be appointed to a term as a [voting] member of the Commission if that youth would become [26] 23 years old during that term.
13	[(c) Agency representatives.]
14 15	[Each of the following entities shall designate a non-voting member to represent that entity:]
16	[(1) Baltimore City Public School System.]
17	[(2) Department of Recreation and Parks.]
18	[(3) Health Department.]
19	[(4) Police Department (PAL Centers).]
20	[(5) Department of Social Services.]
21	[(6) State's Attorney's Office.]
22	[(7) Enoch Pratt Free Library.]
23	[(8) Mayor's Office of Employment Development.]
24	[(9) Housing Authority of Baltimore City.]
25	[(10) State Department of Juvenile Services.]
26	[(11) Family League of Baltimore City.]
27	[(12) Baltimore City Community College.]

1	[(d) Mayoral and Council representatives.]
2	[(1) 2 non-voting, ex officio members are:]
3	[(i) the Mayor; and]
4	[(ii) the President of the City Council.]
5 6	[(2) The Mayor or Council President may designate another person to serve in her or his place.]
7	§ 22-6. Terms, organization, meetings, etc.
8	(a) Terms.
9	(1) The term of a [voting] member expires at the end of the Mayor's term.
10 11	(2) At the end of a term, a [voting] member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
12	(3) A MEMBER MAY ONLY SERVE A MAXIMUM OF 3 TERMS.
13	(b) Compensation; expenses.
14 15	The members of the Commission[:] SERVE WITH COMPENSATION BASED ON HOURS SERVED, AS PROVIDED IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES.
16	[(1) serve without compensation; but]
17 18	[(2) are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, as provided in the Ordinance of Estimates.]
19	(c) [Officers; committees.] OFFICERS.
20	(1) The Mayor shall designate a [voting] member to serve as Commission Chair.
21	[(2) The Chair may select other officers.]
22 23 24	(2) AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH TERM AND AFTER ALL MEMBERS ARE APPOINTED, THE COMMISSION CHAIR SHALL CALL A MEETING OF THE COMMISSION AND THE COMMISSION SHALL ELECT MEMBERS TO SERVE AS:
25	(I) VICE CHAIR;
26	(II) TREASURER; AND
27	(III) SECRETARY.
28 29	[(3) The Chair may appoint committees to assist the Commission in carrying out its functions and duties.]

1	(D) COMMITTEES.
2 3	(1) THERE IS AN EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE IN THE COMMISSION THAT COMPRISES THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:
4	(I) THE CHAIR;
5	(II) THE VICE CHAIR;
6	(III) THE TREASURER;
7	(IV) THE SECRETARY; AND
8	(V) AN AT-LARGE MEMBER, WHO SHALL BE ELECTED BY MAJORITY VOTE OF THE COMMISSIONERS AT THE COMMISSION'S FIRST MEETING.
10	(2) THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:
11 12	(I) MAY EXPEND FUNDS AUTHORIZED IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES OR ANY SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS;
13 14	(II) MAY APPOINT COMMITTEES TO ASSIST THE COMMISSION IN CARRYING OUT ITS FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES; AND
15	(III) SHALL GENERALLY OVERSEE THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE COMMISSION.
16	(E) [(d)] Meetings; quorum.
17 18 19	(1) The Commission shall meet on the call of the Chair as frequently as required to perform its duties, but not less than [6 times nor more than 10 times each year] 1 TIME EACH MONTH.
20 21	(2) A majority of the [voting] members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
22 23	(3) An affirmative vote of at least a majority of a quorum is needed for any official action.
24	(F) CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS.
25	(1) IN GENERAL.
26 27	THE COMMISSION MUST ADOPT A CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS TO GOVERN ITS MEETINGS AND OPERATIONS.
28	(2) Constitution.
29 30	(I) THE COMMISSION MUST ADOPT A CONSTITUTION WITHIN 30 DAYS OF ELECTING THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1 2 3	(II) THE COMMISSION MUST REVIEW, REVISE, AND RE-ADOPT THE CONSTITUTION WITHIN 30 DAYS OF ELECTING A NEW EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AFTER THE START OF EACH NEW MAYORAL TERM.
4	(3) BYLAWS.
5 6	(I) THE COMMISSION MUST ADOPT BYLAWS WITHIN 60 DAYS OF ELECTING THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.
7 8 9	(II) THE COMMISSION MUST REVIEW, REVISE, AND RE-ADOPT THE BYLAWS WITHIN 60 DAYS OF ELECTING A NEW EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AFTER THE START OF EACH NEW MAYORAL TERM.
10	(G) STAFF.
11	THE OFFICE OF CHILDREN AND FAMILY SUCCESS, OR ITS SUCCESSOR, SHALL:
12	(1) PROVIDE STAFF TO THE COMMISSION; AND
13 14 15	(2) PROVIDE THE PERSONNEL AND CAPITAL SUPPORT NECESSARY FOR THE COMMISSION TO PERFORM ITS DUTIES, AS PROVIDED FOR IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES.
16	(H) [(e)] Rules and regulations.
17 18 19	Subject to Title 4 {"Administrative Procedure Act – Regulations"} of the City General Provisions Article, the Commission may adopt rules and regulations to govern its meetings and operations.
20	§ 22-7. [Commission] POWERS AND duties.
21	(A) POWERS.
22	IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER POWERS SPECIFIED IN THIS SUBTITLE, THE COMMISSION MAY:
23 24	(1) ENGAGE, CONSULT, AND PARTNER WITH A CITY OFFICIAL AND ANY UNIT OF CITY GOVERNMENT; AND
25	(2) ENGAGE, CONSULT, AND PARTNER WITH A COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION.
26	(B) DUTIES.
27	The Commission shall:
28 29	[(1) develop and maintain a 3-year plan of action that outlines specific areas for Commission study and recommendations;]
30	[(2) review issues relating to programs and services for children and youth;]

1 2	[(3) identify and recommend priorities among programs and services for children and youth;]
3	[(4) create a forum for discussions with children, youth, and their families;]
4	[(5) advocate services and programs for children and youth;]
5 6 7	[(6) make recommendations for programs, policies, procedures, or legislation it deems necessary to promote the well-being of children, youth, and their families;]
8	[(7) work with the public and private sector in a collaborative effort to:]
9	[(i) bring forth the concerns of children and youth; and]
10 11	[(ii) evaluate and strengthen programming that will enhance the interpersonal and social development of children and youth;]
12 13	[(8) develop a communications network to share information about public and private services to children and youth;]
14	[(9) submit an annual report to the Mayor and the City Council; and]
15	[(10) perform any other duties that the Mayor requests.]
16 17	(1) CREATE AND DELIVER A YEAR-END ANNUAL REPORT ON COMMISSION ACTIVITIES TO THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL;
18 19 20	(2) REVIEW RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO CHILDREN AND YOUTH AND PROVIDE FEEDBACK REGARDING EFFECTIVENESS TO THE RESPECTIVE RESOURCE ADMINISTRATOR;
21 22	(3) HOST AND PARTICIPATE IN PUBLIC FORUMS WITH AND ABOUT CHILDREN AND YOUTH;
23	(4) ADVOCATE FOR RESOURCES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH;
24 25 26	(5) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PROGRAMS, POLICIES, PROCEDURES, OR LEGISLATION DEEMED NECESSARY TO PROMOTE THE WELL-BEING OF CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND THEIR FAMILIES;
27 28	(6) RAISE AWARENESS OF RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND THEIR FAMILIES; AND
29 30 31	(7) REVIEW AND EVALUATE EXISTING AND PROPOSED POLICIES, PROGRAMS, AND LEGISLATION AS THEY RELATE TO THE WELL-BEING OF CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND THEIR FAMILIES.

1 § 2	2-8. AGENC	Y COOPERATION.	
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2	ALL CITY OFFICIALS AND AGENCIES SHALL COOPERATE WITH THE COMMISSION AND EXTEND
3	THE SERVICES AND FACILITIES THAT THE COMMISSION REQUIRES TO THE EXTENT THAT THE
1	OFFICIALS AND AGENCIES ARE ABLE TO DO SO GIVEN PERSONNEL AND BUDGETS AS PROVIDED
5	IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
