10 11 12 13	This subtitle automatically expires on [August 31, 2020] DECEMBER 31, 2021, unless the City Council, after causing an appropriate study to be undertaken, conducting public hearings, and hearing testimonial evidence, finds that the purposes identified in this subtitle have not yet been achieved, in which case this subtitle may be extended for 5 more years.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the Mayor and City Council finds that the existing disparity study remains a valid factual predicate for the Minority and Women's Busines Program and provides sufficient legal justification for continuing the Program during the interimentation period enacted by this Ordinance.
18 19 20	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
