REQUEST: City Council Bill #14-0375/ Revenue Obligations - Water Projects - Maximum
Aggregate Principal Amount

For the purpose of increasing the maximum aggregate principal amount of revenue obligations that may be issued by the City under Ordinance 02-331, as last amended by Ordinance 11-429; and providing for a special effective date.

<u>City Council Bill #14-0376/ Revenue Obligations - Wastewater Projects - Maximum Aggregate Principal Amount</u>

For the purpose of increasing the maximum aggregate principal amount of revenue obligations that may be issued by the City under Ordinance 02-332, as last amended by Ordinance 11-430; and providing for a special effective date.

RECOMMENDATION: Approval

BACKGROUND

The proposed Water and Wastewater Ordinances increase the maximum debt limit for the Water Utility System from \$1,017M to \$2,152M, and the Wastewater Utility System from \$1,110M to \$2,363M. This legislation is required by City Charter Article II - General Powers - Section 50 - Revenue Bonds and Obligations; mandating the that revenue bonds be authorized by an ordinance of the City Council.

In addition to authorizing revenue bonds, Article II specifies that such debt shall not be a general obligation or a pledge of the City's full faith and credit, but rather shall be a revenue obligation of the Water and Wastewater Utility Systems.

ANALYSIS

The Council's first such action authorizing water and wastewater revenue bonds occurred on May 21, 1990 with enactment of Ordinances 495 and 496. Since that time, Council has increased the authorization on six separate occasions to the current limit of \$1,017M (water) and \$1,110M (wastewater). The most recent authorization increase was following the enactment of Ordinances 11-429 and 11-430 on March 25, 2011. This and previous increases were required to accommodate new debt issuances in support of the water and wastewater capital programs.

Water and wastewater revenue bonds will soon reach the maximum authorized limit. Increases are expected from time to time as the respective systems comply with federal standards and maintain existing infrastructure.

Without an increase, the wastewater system will run out of authorization this year and the water system next year. When this occurs there will be no means to raise the required funding to construct the projects identified in the capital budget.

In July 2013, the Board of Estimates approved <u>water rate increases</u> of 15% for FY2014, 11% for FY2015, and 11% for FY2016. In July 2013, the Board of Estimates approved <u>sewer rate increases</u> of 15% for FY2014, 11% for FY2015, and 11% for FY2016.

The Department of Public Works will continue to look for efficiencies and savings to minimize future rate increases while making the necessary investments to address extensive capital needs.

CONFORMITY TO PLANS

These authorizations can only fund projects that are in the CIP and incorporated into the annual capital budget to include approvals by the Planning Commission, Board of Finance, Board of Estimates and the City Council.
