304.7.1 ELEVATION REQUIRED – GENERAL. [All] EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED IN THIS § 304.7, ALL stored objects and materials must be elevated at least 1 foot off
the ground to prevent rat harborage.
304.7.2 Elevation required – Exceptions. The requirements of § 304.7.1 do
NOT APPLY TO:
A. RAIN BARRELS STORED ON A HARD AND IMPERVIOUS SURFACE, OR
B. [unless] ANY OTHER OBJECTS OR MATERIALS FOR WHICH THE CODE OFFICIAL
DETERMINES THAT elevation is [determined] unnecessary [by the
commissioner].
303.7.3 [304.7.1] Caveat. Nothing in this section authorizes any outdoor storage
that is otherwise prohibited by law.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
Ordinance.
SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day
after the date it is enacted.
