Section(s) 9

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

Ordinance 07-474

SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That, except as provided in
Sections 5 through 8 of this Ordinance, this Ordinance takes effect on the 30th day
after the date it is enacted. ~~{It will remain effective for 5 years~~ THROUGH JUNE 30,
2020, and at the end of that period ~~IMMEDIATELY AFTER THAT DATE,~~ with no
further action by the Mayor and City Council, this Ordinance will be abrogated
and of no further effect.}

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on July 1,
2012.
