## **Major Issues Discussed**

## 1. Technical Fixes to Gas-Powered Debris Removal Equipment Prohibition:

- Purpose of clarifying and conforming enforcement provisions for previously passed legislation
- Addressing practical and legal barriers that were inadvertently missed in original bill
- Ensuring the law can be effectively applied and upheld in real-world situations

## 2. Citizen Reporting Mechanism:

- Impracticality of expecting health department officials to witness violations in realtime
- Need for citizen-initiated enforcement through reports and photographic evidence
- Addition of explicit affidavit requirement to formalize the reporting process
- Ensuring enforcement actions can be taken based on citizen documentation

## 3. Cease and Desist Process:

- Law structured to issue cease and desist before fines for violations
- Original bill omitted ability to issue cease and desist based on photographic evidence
- Technical correction to allow cease and desist orders based on complaint, photo evidence, and affidavit
- Creating logical progression from reporting to enforcement

## 4. Enforcement Mechanism Corrections:

- Original bill mistakenly included both civil and criminal penalties
- Clarification that enforcement should be environmental or civil, not criminal
- Addition of environmental citation enforcement mechanisms
- Placement of appropriate penalties in correct sections of the code

## 5. **Property-Based Enforcement Approach:**

- Practical difficulties in identifying and enforcing against unknown contractors
- Solution of tying violations to property owners rather than equipment operators
- Creating accountability for property owners who hire services using prohibited equipment
- Ensuring consistent enforcement regardless of who operates the equipment
