The Environmental Control Board (ECB) has no objections to the bill as written.

The bill begins by defining the term private kennels by adding section 10-101(cc-1) to the Health Code. The bill then inserts into previously reserved sections 10-213 and 10-221 to the Health Code. These two sections define the procedure to apply for a private kennel and how the license can be revoked respectively.

With respect to these three changes in the City Code, ECB opposes none of them. Also ECB does not oppose repealing and reordaining with amendments section 10-210 in the Health Article.

The final part of this bill repeals and reordains with amendments Article 1 Section 40-14(e) (7) and Section 41-14(6). These two sections each are amended by adding a penalty of \$100 for not having a license for operating a private kennel. ECB does not oppose these amendments.
