## AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

1	Curfews – "Milk Bars"
2 3	For the purpose of repealing the curfew on entertainment by and related provisions governing so-called "milk bars".

5	Article 19 - Police Ordinances
6	Section(s) 31-1 through 31-5, and
7	the subtitle designation "Subtitle 31. 'Milk Bars'"

10 11	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:
12	Baltimore City Code
13	Article 19. Police Ordinances
14	[Subtitle 31. "Milk Bars"]
15	[§ 31-1. Purpose.
16	It is hereby declared to be the intention of this subtitle to eliminate the objectionable features
17	and evils of so-called milk bars, as described by the report of the Grand Jury of Baltimore
18	City for the September Term, 1947.]
19	[§ 31-2. Curfew on entertainment.
20	No person, firm, or corporation having a license to sell milk, food, or other merchandise
21	shall, between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. on any day except on New Year's Day, provide
22	any amusement or entertainment, such as dancing, music, or any exhibition of any character.]

**EXPLANATION:** CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law. Underlining indicates matter added to the bill by amendment. Strike out indicates matter stricken from the bill by amendment or deleted from existing law by amendment.

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1	[§ 31-3. Permits for special occasions.
2 3	Provided, however, that the Police Commissioner may, in his discretion, grant a permit for providing entertainment, etc., for any particular event or occasion.]
4	[§ 31-4. Exemptions.
5 6	Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit the operation of a duly licensed motion picture theatre between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.]
7	[§ 31-5. Penalties.
8 9	Any person violating any of the provisions of this subtitle shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject:
10	(1) to a penalty of not more than \$100 for the 1st offense; and
11 12	(2) for a 2 <sup>nd</sup> or any subsequent offense, to a penalty of not more than \$100 or confinement to jail not exceeding 6 months, or to both, in the discretion of the court.]
13 14 15	<b>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
16 17	<b>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
