Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 22-0198 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill is for the purpose of naming the Baltimore City Health Department Building, located at 1001 East Fayette Street, the Dr. Maxie T. Collier Health Department Building.

The City Code requires that property owned by the Mayor and City Council be named by ordinance. City Code, Art. 5, § 20-1, *et. seq.* The municipal agency that “has or will have control” over the property must be referred the bill for comment, in addition to the Planning Commission and the Department of Real Estate. §20-2(b). As the bill was referred to these agencies, these requirements have been met, and the Law Department approves Council Bill 22-198 for form and legal sufficiency.
