Article 6 - Historical and Architectural Preservation
Section(s) 13-1, to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 13. Landmark List-2010s"

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

## Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation

Subtitle 13. Landmark List - 2010s

## § 13-1. Waverly Town Hall.

Waverly Town Hall, 3100 Greenmount Avenue (Block 3881, Lot 10/12).
Section 2. And be it further ordained, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.

Section 3. And be it further ordained, That this Ordinance takes effect on the $30^{\text {th }}$ day after the date it is enacted.
