1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 **Bond Issue — Recreation, Parks and Public Facilities Loan — \$47,000,000**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore (pursuant to Resolution
4 II of 2014 approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing
5 Baltimore City) to create a debt, and to issue and sell its certificates of indebtedness as
6 evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding \$47,000,000 from the sale of such certificates
7 of indebtedness to be used for the cost of issuance, including the expense of engraving,
8 printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected therewith,
9 and the remainder of such proceeds shall be used for the development of the buildings owned
10 or controlled by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, the Enoch Pratt Free Library,
11 public park and recreational land, property, buildings, structures or facilities; for the
12 acquisition and installation of trees for tree planting programs, including but not limited to,
13 the acquisition by purchase, lease, condemnation or any other legal means, of land or
14 property, or any rights therein, in the City of Baltimore, and constructing and erecting on said
15 land or property, or on any land or property, new buildings, structures, and auxiliary facilities;
16 and for the renovation, alteration, construction, reconstruction, installation, improvement and
17 repair of existing buildings, structures or facilities, to be or now being used for or in
18 connection with the operations, functions and activities of the Mayor and City Council of
19 Baltimore and the Enoch Pratt Free Library, public park and recreational land, the demolition,
20 removal, relocation, renovation or alteration of land, buildings, streets, highways, alleys,
21 utilities or services, and other structures or improvements, and for the construction,
22 reconstruction, installation, relocation or repair of buildings, streets, highways, alleys, utilities
23 or services, and other structures or improvements; for the acquisition of trees or tree planting
24 programs and for equipment and fixtures for any and all facilities authorized to be
25 constructed, erected, altered, reconstructed, renovated, reconstructed, installed or improved
26 by the provisions hereof; the payment of any and all costs and expenses incurred for or in
27 connection with doing any or all of the things herein mentioned, including but not limited to,
28 the costs and expenses of securing administrative, appraisal, economic analysis, engineering,
29 planning, designing, architectural, surveying and other professional services; and for doing
30 any and all things necessary, proper or expedient in connection with or pertaining to any or
31 all of the matters or things hereinbefore mentioned; authorizing the issuance of refunding
32 bonds; conferring and imposing upon the Board of Finance of Baltimore City certain powers
33 and duties; authorizing the submission of this Ordinance to the legal voters of the City of

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1 Baltimore, for their approval or disapproval, at the General Election to be held in Baltimore
2 City on Tuesday, the 4th day of November, 2014; and providing for the expenditure of the
3 proceeds of sale of said certificates of indebtedness in accordance with the provisions of the
4 Charter of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and by the municipal agency designated
5 in the annual Ordinance of Estimates of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

6 **WHEREAS**, By Resolution II of 2014, approved by the members of the Maryland General
7 Assembly representing Baltimore City, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore is authorized to
8 create a debt and to issue and sell its certificates of indebtedness (hereinafter called "bonds") as
9 evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding \$47,000,000 from the sale of such bonds to be used
10 for recreation, parks, and environmental improvement purposes as authorized by said Resolution;
11 and

12 **WHEREAS**, Funds are now needed for said purposes; now, therefore,

13 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the
14 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance of said
15 municipality, be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to create a debt and to issue and sell
16 bonds of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore from time to time, as may be needed or
17 required for the purposes hereinafter named and said bonds shall be sold by the Board of Finance
18 from time to time and at such times as shall be requisite, and proceeds not exceeding
19 \$47,000,000 from the sale of such bonds shall be used for the purposes hereinafter named,
20 provided that this Ordinance shall not become effective unless it shall be approved by a majority
21 of the votes of the legal voters of Baltimore City cast at the time and place hereinafter designated
22 by this Ordinance.

23 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That:

24 (a) The denomination or denominations of the bonds to be issued at any particular time
25 and the place or places for the payment of principal and interest thereof are to be determined by
26 the Board of Finance.

27 (b) The bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this Ordinance
28 may be issued to mature on such dates and in such amounts as the Board of Finance may
29 determine; provided that the entire principal amount represented thereby shall be discharged not
30 more than 40 years from the date of issuance of the bonds.

31 (c) The bonds, when issued, shall bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined
32 by the Board of Finance, which rate or rates may be fixed or variable or as determined by a
33 method approved by the Board of Finance, and such interest shall be payable at such time or
34 times as may be determined by the Board of Finance.

35 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That a majority of the Board of Finance of the
36 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore be, and they are hereby, authorized to pass a resolution or
37 resolutions, from time to time, to determine and set forth any or all of the following:

38 (a) The amount of debt to be incurred by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore at any
39 particular time, and from time to time, under and pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance;
40 the date or dates when any bonds representing said debt, or any part thereof, are to mature, and
41 the amount or amounts of said debt, or any part thereof, which shall mature upon the aforesaid

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1 date or dates; and the date or dates in each year, during the entire period of time when any of said
2 bonds are outstanding, when interest on any of said bonds shall be payable;

3 (b) The form or forms of the bonds representing the debt, or any part thereof, authorized
4 to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance at any particular time; and

5 (c) If the bonds are to be sold at public sale, the time, place, manner and medium of
6 advertisement of the readiness of the Board of Finance, acting for and on behalf of the Mayor and
7 City Council of Baltimore, to receive bids for the purchase of the bonds authorized to be issued
8 hereunder or any part thereof; the form, terms and conditions of such bids; the time, place and
9 manner of awarding bonds so bid for, including the right whenever any of the bonds authorized
10 by this Ordinance are offered for sale and sold at the same time as other bonds of the City, to
11 establish the conditions for bids and awards and to award all of the bonds on an all or none basis,
12 and the time, place, terms and manner of settlement for the bonds so bid for; provided, however,
13 that notwithstanding anything in this section, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, or the
14 Board of Finance, as the case may be, shall have the right to reject any or all bids therefor for any
15 reason.

16 **SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:**

17 (a) All premiums resulting from the sale of any of the bonds issued and sold pursuant to
18 the provisions of this Ordinance shall be applied as directed by the Board of Finance.

19 (b) The debt authorized by the provisions of this Ordinance, and the bonds issued and
20 sold pursuant thereto and their transfer, and the principal and interest payable thereon (including
21 any profit made in the sale thereof), shall be and remain exempt from any and all State, county
22 and municipal taxation in the State of Maryland.

23 (c) All bonds issued and sold pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance may be sold at
24 public sale by the solicitation of competitive bids or at private (negotiated) sale without
25 advertisement or solicitation of competitive bids, for a price or prices which may be at, above or
26 below par value of the bonds, as determined by resolution of the Board of Finance of the Mayor
27 and City Council of Baltimore.

28 **SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That** until all of the interest on and principal of
29 any bonds issued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance have been paid in full, the Mayor
30 and City Council of Baltimore shall levy and impose an annual tax on each \$100 of assessable
31 property in the City of Baltimore at a rate sufficient to produce revenue to pay all interest on and
32 principal of all bonds theretofore issued and outstanding or authorized to be issued and
33 outstanding, payable in the next succeeding year.

34 **SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That** this Ordinance shall be submitted to the
35 legal voters of the City of Baltimore, for their approval or disapproval, at the General Election to
36 be held in Baltimore City, on Tuesday, the 4th day of November, 2014.

37 **SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That** prior to the date of the election
38 hereinbefore mentioned, notice shall be given to the public of the amount of money which the
39 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore is authorized to borrow, and the general purposes for
40 which such borrowed funds may be expended, under the terms and provisions of this Ordinance,
41 and the time when the election hereinbefore mentioned is to be held; and such public notice shall

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1 be given in such manner and by such means or through such media and at such time or times as
2 may be determined, from time to time, by a majority of the Board of Finance.

3 **SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the actual cash proceeds derived from the
4 sale of the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be used
5 exclusively for the following purposes, to wit:

6 (a) So much thereof as may be necessary for the cost of issuance, including the expense of
7 engraving, printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected
8 therewith (which may include the proportion of the compensation of employees and general
9 administrative expenses of the Department of Finance reasonably allocated to the issuance of the
10 bonds);

11 (b) The remainder of such proceeds shall be used for the development of the buildings
12 owned or controlled by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, the Enoch Pratt Free Library,
13 public park and recreational land, property, buildings, structures or facilities; for the acquisition
14 and installation of trees for tree planting programs, including but not limited to, the acquisition
15 by purchase, lease, condemnation or any other legal means, of land or property, or any rights
16 therein, in the City of Baltimore, and constructing and erecting on said land or property, or on
17 any land or property, new buildings, structures, and auxiliary facilities; and for the renovation,
18 alteration, construction, reconstruction, installation, improvement and repair of existing
19 buildings, structures or facilities, to be or now being used for or in connection with the
20 operations, functions and activities of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore and the Enoch
21 Pratt Free Library, public park and recreational land, the demolition, removal, relocation,
22 renovation or alteration of land, buildings, streets, highways, alleys, utilities or services, and
23 other structures or improvements, and for the construction, reconstruction, installation, relocation
24 or repair of buildings, streets, highways, alleys, utilities or services, and other structures or
25 improvements; for the acquisition of trees or tree planting programs and for equipment and
26 fixtures for any and all facilities authorized to be constructed, erected, altered, reconstructed,
27 renovated, reconstructed, installed or improved by the provisions hereof; the payment of any and
28 all costs and expenses incurred for or in connection with doing any or all of the things herein
29 mentioned, including but not limited to, the costs and expenses of securing administrative,
30 appraisal, economic analysis, engineering, planning, designing, architectural, surveying and other
31 professional services; and for doing any and all things necessary, proper or expedient in
32 connection with or pertaining to any or all of the matters or things hereinbefore mentioned.

33 **SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That:

34 (a) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance
35 thereof, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue its bonds for the purpose of refunding any
36 bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance by payment at maturity or
37 the purchase or redemption of bonds in advance of maturity. The validity of any refunding bonds
38 shall in no way be dependent upon or related to the validity or invalidity of the bonds being
39 refunded. Such refunding bonds may be issued by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore,
40 acting by and through the Board of Finance thereof, for the purpose of providing it with funds to
41 pay any of its outstanding bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance at
42 maturity, to purchase in the open market any of its outstanding bonds authorized to be issued
43 under the provisions of this Ordinance prior to their maturity, to redeem prior to their maturity
44 any outstanding bonds which are, by their terms, redeemable, to pay interest on any outstanding
45 bonds prior to their payment at maturity or purchase or redemption in advance of maturity, or to

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1 pay any redemption or purchase premium in connection with the refunding of any of its
2 outstanding bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance.

3 (b) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
4 Ordinance may be issued for the public purpose of:

5 (1) Realizing savings to Baltimore City in the aggregate cost of debt service on either
6 a direct comparison or present value basis; or

7 (2) Debt restructuring that:

8 (i) In the aggregate effects such a reduction in the cost of debt service; or

9 (ii) Is determined by the Board of Finance of the Mayor and City Council of
10 Baltimore to be in the best interests of Baltimore City, to be consistent with Baltimore City's
11 long-term financial plan, and to realize a financial objective of Baltimore City including,
12 improving the relationship of debt service to a source of payment such as taxes, assessments, or
13 other charges.

14 (c) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
15 Ordinance may be issued in whatever principal amount shall be required to achieve the purpose
16 for the issuance of the refunding bonds, which amount may be in excess of the principal amount
17 of the bonds refunded or the maximum principal amount of bonds authorized to be issued under
18 Section 1 of this Ordinance.

19 (d) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
20 Ordinance may be issued to mature on such dates and in such amounts as the Board of Finance
21 may determine; provided that the entire principal amount represented by the refunding bonds
22 shall be discharged not more than 40 years from the date of issuance of the bonds being refunded.

23 (e) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
24 Ordinance may be sold at public sale by the solicitation of competitive bids or at private
25 (negotiated) sale without advertisement or solicitation of competitive bids, for a price or prices
26 which may be at, above or below the par value of the refunding bonds, as determined by
27 resolution of the Board of Finance of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

28 (f) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
29 Ordinance shall bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined by the Board of Finance
30 of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, which rate or rates may be fixed or variable or as
31 determined by a method approved by the Board of Finance, and such interest shall be payable at
32 such time or times as may be determined by the Board of Finance.

33 (g) The proceeds of the sale of any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold
34 under the provisions of this Ordinance, after the payment of issuance costs relating thereto, shall
35 be set aside by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore as a separate trust fund to be used solely
36 for the purposes stated in this Section 9.

37 (h) Except as otherwise provided in this Section 9, the powers granted in, the limitations
38 and obligations imposed by, and the procedures specified in this Ordinance with respect to the
39 issuance of bonds shall be applicable to the issuance of refunding bonds.

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1 (i) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
2 Ordinance shall not be subject to any debt policy limitation that may from time to time be
3 established by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

4 **SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the expenditure of the proceeds derived
5 from the sale of the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be
6 in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and
7 by the municipal agency designated in the annual Ordinance of Estimates of the Mayor and City
8 Council of Baltimore.
