<b>We Our Us</b>	Gun Violence - CVI Expansion	In the Violence Prevention Plan, the Mayor committed to a dramatic expansion of Baltimore's community violence intervention (CVI) ecosystem from 10 contracts to 30 contracts. As MONSE works to foster and grow this ecosystem, Baltimore will establish contracts with community-based organizations engaged in outreach, mediation, violence intervention, hospital-based violence intervention, life coaching, and victim services.
<b>ROAR, TurnAround Inc.</b>	Gun Violence - CVI - Survivor Wraparound Services	As outlined in the Mayor's Violence Prevention Plan, Baltimore is in the process of increasing its investment in supporting gunshot victims and training on victim services. The Rebuild, Overcome, and Rise (ROAR) Center at the University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) and TurnAround, Inc. will provide healing for survivors, with a special focus on meeting the unique needs of gun violence survivors and human trafficking survivors.
<b>Sage Wellness</b>	Gun Violence - CVI - Mental Health Support	Sage Wellness will facilitate professional development opportunities and provide mental health and grief counseling services to Safe Streets workers.



<p><b>Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS)</b></p>	<p>Returning Citizens Behind the Wall</p>	<p>In partnership with the Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS), the Scott administration will be starting to work with people behind bars in the months prior to their release. MONSE will work with MOED, DPW, and BCRP to provide training and paid employment for people preparing to transition back into their communities, along with providing wraparound supports before and upon their return.</p>
<p><b>Tuerk House</b></p>	<p>Harm Reduction and Addiction Grant</p>	<p>Implementing an evidence-based, harm reduction approach rooted in public health has the power to save countless lives in our city. As outlined in the Mayor's Violence Prevention Plan, the Mayor will work closely with MONSE and the Health Department to implement a harm reduction approach in City government while directly funding community partners to minimize harm, save lives, and reduce violence associated with active addiction.</p>
<p><b>Healing City Baltimore</b></p>	<p>Youth and Trauma - Operating Support</p>	<p>These dollars will be used for operating support for Healing City Baltimore, a sustained movement of neighbors committed to trauma-informed practice and healing the city together as a foundation to pursuing a racially, socially, and economically just and thriving Baltimore for all.</p>



<p><b>TurnAround Inc.</b></p>	<p>Victim Services - Proactive Human Trafficking Investigations</p>	<p>Understanding that most victims of human trafficking rarely go to law enforcement for help, MONSE will work in partnership with TurnAround Inc. to proactively identify human trafficking and ensure victims can access services and support available to them. Additionally, TurnAround will conduct street outreach along the Garrison Blvd corridor.</p>
<p><b>Baltimore Ceasefire, Roca, We Our Us</b></p>	<p>Neighborhood Stabilization Response</p>	<p>MONSE will work with community-based providers and local, state, and federal agencies to bring resources into neighborhoods pre- and post-traumatic events, including mass shootings, police-involved shootings, major law enforcement takedowns, and other traumatizing events.</p>
<p><b>Baltimore Community Mediation Center</b></p>	<p>Neighborhoods - Evaluation - Listening Tours</p>	<p>BCMC will facilitate a series of listening tours across Baltimore to measure resident perception of safety. MONSE will use the results to drive service and safety delivery by neighborhood.</p>
<p><b>University of Baltimore</b></p>	<p>Neighborhood Capacity Assessment</p>	<p>As mentioned in the Mayor's Violence Prevention Plan, MONSE will work with Dr. Seema Iyer at the University of Baltimore to analyze Baltimore's CBO landscape and implement a capacity-building plan to strengthen these efforts.</p>



<p><b>Baltimore Civic Fund</b></p>	<p>Stipends for Community Grant Reviewers</p>	<p>Community reviewers are an integral part of the MONSE Grants Process, and they are the backbone of how funding for these grants is determined.
