Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Clarification of School-Based Health Centers vs. School Health Suites: Defined the difference between comprehensive health services provided by School-Based Health Centers and basic services akin to a school nurse in School Health Suites.
- 2. Infrastructure and Capacity Challenges: Baltimore City Schools highlighted their current lack of necessary infrastructure (labs, medication setups) hindering the operation of School-Based Health Centers.
- 3. Partnerships and Future Plans: Emphasis on partnerships with Baltimore City Health Department (BCHD), Baltimore Medical System (BMS), and Johns Hopkins University for staffing and operational support.
- 4. Funding and Operational Costs: Discussions on funding sources and operational costs associated with running school-based health centers.
- 5. Equity in Access to Health Services: Concerns about ensuring equal access to health services among students, particularly in underserved areas.
- 6. Impact on Health and Educational Outcomes: Evaluation of how school-based health centers influence health outcomes and educational achievement among students.
- 7. Sustainability and Integration: Strategies for sustainable integration of health services within school settings, ensuring long-term effectiveness.
- 8. Assessment of School Health Services: Efforts focused on assessing and improving the quality of health services provided within Baltimore City Schools, addressing disparities and gaps.
- 9. Funding Formula Standardization: Discussions centered around standardizing funding formulas for school-based health centers based on service types, operational hours, and number of centers.
- 10. Community Health Needs: Highlighted specific health needs within Baltimore communities, such as asthma and diabetes rates among school children, exacerbated by COVID-19 challenges.
- 11. Impact Evaluation and Partnership Coordination: Emphasis on evaluating the overall impact of school-based health centers and coordinating efforts between Baltimore City Health Department, City Schools, and external partners.

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- 1. Request for improved data interoperability between school-based health centers, schools, and health departments to facilitate seamless access to student health records.
- 2. Detailed data on school-by-school healthcare provider services and attendance over the past three years was requested to assess the impact of health services on student attendance and outcomes.
- 3. Request for transparency regarding funding sources allocated for upgrading Health Suites and establishing new Health Centers within schools.
- 4. Clarification was sought on why federal funds, such as Esser funding and Blueprint funds, were not prioritized for expanding health centers across Baltimore schools.
- 5. Request for detailed information on the staffing levels of Registered Nurses (RNs) supervising LPNs and CNAs across all school-based health centers, along with the use of external vendors for additional support.
- 6. Request for why some schools or health centers choose not to participate in the Maryland School-Based Health Center Program despite potential benefits and associated grants.
- 7. Further clarification and data sharing were requested regarding operational details of school-based health centers, including funding breakdowns, staffing levels, and service delivery across Baltimore City.
