Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Chairman Costello called the hearing to order.
- 2. Councilman Schleifer explained the purpose and need for the bill.
- 3. Hilary Ruley confirmed that the Law Department can approve the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
- 4. Eric Tiso confirmed the recommendations in the Planning Commission's written report and explained the proposed amendment to eliminate the sunset provision in the bill.
- 5. Derek Baumgardner confirmed BMZA's recommendation that the Council pass the bill with the amendment to eliminate the sunset provision. He explained that the bill will clarify that BMZA can hold hearings virtually during the emergency and noted that BMZA plans to resume normal, in-person hearings as soon as possible.
- 6. Councilwoman Clarke noted that BMZA hearings often draw many concerned residents and that many of them could have difficulty participating in virtual hearings. She further noted that many Baltimoreans lack internet access.
- 7. Councilman Reisinger noted that removing the sunset provision would give BMZA flexibility and that the COVID-19 emergency may not be over by the sunset date in the bill.
- 8. The Committee considered and adopted the amendment to eliminate the sunset provision, with five members voting yes and two members voting no.
