13	Part 1. Baltimore Office of Promotion and the Arts – Background
14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21	The City Council reduced the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2024 by \$1,744,002 in Service 824 (Events: Art: Culture: and Film), which supports the Baltimore Office of Promotion and the Arts' ("BOPA") budget. City Council Resolution 23-0177R, adopted on June 14, 2023, detailed concerns regarding the following: (1) BOPA's board governance and structure; (2) operations of the Baltimore Film Office; (3) operations of the Baltimore Arts Council and Public Arts Commission; and (4) BOPA's ability to carry out its mandate to produce events and festivals, administer grants, manage arts education and public art programming, provide film production support, and provide oversight of Baltimore City facilities in its care.
22 23 24 25	The Administration and City Council have determined that marked progress has been made in these areas in the time since 23-0177R was adopted. Ordinance 23-274, effective October 15, 2023, and Ordinance 24-300, effective January 17, 2024, each restored \$581,334 to Service 824, totaling \$1,162,668.

1 2 3 4 5	This is the 3 <sup>rd</sup> supplemental appropriation that will restore funding to the Baltimore Office of Promotion and the Arts in recognition that BOPA has complied with the requested actions of the City Council. This supplementary appropriation will restore the final portion of the monies originally cut from the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2024. This supplementary appropriation shall fund BOPA for the 4 <sup>th</sup> quarter of Fiscal Year 2024.
6	Part 2. Supplementary Appropriation
7 8 9	The revenue appropriated by this Ordinance represents Transfer Tax revenue in excess of the revenue relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2024.
10 11	This additional revenue could not have been reasonably anticipated when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2024 was formulated.
12 13 14	This appropriation is made necessary by a material change in circumstances since the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2024 was formulated or is for a new program that could not have been reasonably anticipated when that Ordinance of Estimates was formulated.
15 16	On January 24, 2024, the Board of Estimates recommended this appropriation to the City Council.
17 18 19 20 21 22	<b>SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE</b> , That \$581,334 shall be made available to M-R: Arts and Culture – Service 824 (Events: Art: Culture: and Film) as a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation for Fiscal Year 2024, to provide funding for general operations. The source of revenue for this appropriation is Transfer Tax revenue in excess of the amount from this source that was relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2024.
23 24	<b>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
