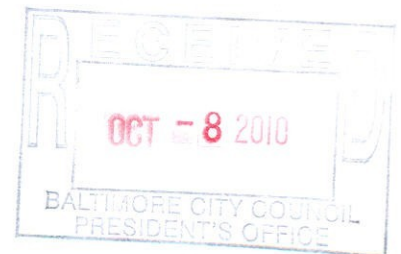
RE: Bill No. 10-0587 Baltimore City Landmark List: Public Interiors-The Senator Theatre
