A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 **Sale of Property – 732 West Lexington Street**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public  
4 or private sale, all its interest in certain property known as 732 West Lexington Street (Block  
5 0586, Lot 002) and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective  
6 date.

12 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That, in  
13 accordance with Article II, § 15(c) of the City Charter, the Commissioner of Housing and  
14 Community Development may sell, at either public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor  
15 and City Council of Baltimore in the property known as 732 West Lexington Street (Block 0586,  
16 Lot 002), and more particularly described as follows:

17 The subject parcel (Block 0586, Lot 002) is an unimproved parcel of land located  
18 in the Poppleton Urban Renewal Area, consisting of approximately 63,641 square  
19 feet, more or less.

20 This property being no longer needed for public use.

21 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance  
22 unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.

23 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is  
24 enacted.
