Purpose: For the purpose of condemning and closing a portion of North Chapel Street extending northerly 305.2 feet more or less, from the north side of Jefferson Street bounded by McElderry Street, North Washington Street, Jefferson Street, and North Wolfe Street, as shown on a plat numbered 309 A 30A, prepared by the Survey Section and filed in the Office of the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special effective date.

BACKGROUND

Bill Summary

Council Bill 25-0086 authorizes the Department of Transportation to condemn and permanently close a portion of North Chapel Street in Baltimore. The area to be closed is about 6,100 square feet (0.14 acres). It begins at the intersection of the west side of North Chapel Street and the south side of McElderry Street, extends 20 feet east to the east side of North Chapel Street, continues south about 305 feet to Jefferson Street, goes 20 feet west, and then runs north about 305 feet back to the starting point.

The closing will follow all applicable state and local laws and Department of Transportation regulations. The City will retain ownership of all underground structures and utilities until they are formally abandoned or relocated, and anyone wishing to remove or alter them must obtain permission and pay all related costs. No buildings or other structures can be constructed on the closed portion until City-owned subsurface utilities are either abandoned

or relocated under City direction. Any privately owned subsurface structures must be removed by their owners when notified. The City will maintain ongoing access to the property and to any underground infrastructure for inspection, maintenance, and repairs without needing the property owner's consent or compensation.

FOR the purpose of condemning and closing a portion of North Chapel Street extending northerly 305.2 feet more or less, from the north side of Jefferson Street bounded by McElderry Street, North Washington Street, Jefferson Street, and North Wolfe Street, as shown on a plat numbered 309-A-30A, prepared by the Survey Section and filed in the Office of the Department of Transportation; and providing for a special effective date.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
Department of Transportation shall proceed to condemn and close a portion of North Chapel
Street, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning for Parcel 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the west side of North Chapel Street 20 feet wide, and the south side of McElderry Street 66 feet wide, said point of beginning being Easterly 140 feet more or less, measured along the south side of said McElderry Street from the intersection of east side of North Wolfe Street 70 feet wide and the south side of said McElderry Street; thence binding on the south side of said McElderry Street Easterly 20 feet to the east side of said North Chapel Street; thence binding on the east side of said North Chapel Street Southerly 305.2 feet more or less, to the intersect the north side of Jefferson Street 60 feet wide; thence binding on the north side of said Jefferson Street Westerly 20 feet to the west side of said North Chapel Street; and thence binding on the west side of said North Chapel Street Northerly 305.2 feet more or less, to the place of beginning.

1	Containing 6,100 square feet or 0.140 acres more or less,
2	As delineated on a plat numbered 309-A-30A, prepared by the Survey Section, and
3	filed on May 8, 2024 in the Office of the Department of Transportation.
4	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the proceedings for the condemnation and
5	closing of the portion of North Chapel Street and the rights of all interested parties shall be
6	regulated by and in accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all
7	applicable rules and regulations.
8	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all
9	subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore
10	continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their use has been
11	abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or interfere with
12	them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council and, in the
13	application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every kind, arising
14	out of the removal, alteration, or interference.
15	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no building or structure of any kind
16	(including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of
17	the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by
18	the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council
19	or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and
20	relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director of
21	Transportation of Baltimore City.
22	SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all
23	subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City
24	Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon
25	notice to do so from the Director of Transportation.
26	SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That at all times after the closing under this
27	Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized
28	representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and
29	appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining,
30	repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from
31	or pay compensation to the owner of the property.
32	SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
33	enacted.

Position: Does Not Oppose

The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 25-0086, City Streets – Closing – A Portion of North Chapel Street. This bill authorizes the Department of Transportation to condemn and close a segment of North Chapel Street approximately 305.2 feet in length and 20 feet wide, located between McElderry Street and Jefferson Street. The bill preserves the City's rights to existing subsurface infrastructure and places responsibility for relocation or removal on the requesting party.

Background

Introduced by the Council President at the request of the Administration, this ordinance facilitates the formal closure of a defined right-of-way segment. It expressly retains the City's ownership and access rights to existing infrastructure and prohibits new construction until City infrastructure is abandoned or relocated at the developer's expense. The closure is delineated on Plat No. 309-A-30A and is regulated by the City Charter and all applicable laws and rules adopted by the Director of Transportation.

Fiscal Impact

The Department of Finance anticipates no fiscal impact as a result of this legislation. All associated costs will be borne by the developer or requesting party. The City retains full access to existing infrastructure without incurring additional costs or liabilities.

Conclusion

Council Bill 25-0086 authorizes the orderly and legally supported closure of a designated portion of North Chapel Street, with appropriate safeguards to preserve the City's infrastructure interests and operational authority. The ordinance reflects standard street closure practices and does not pose a financial risk to the City.

BILL SYNOPSIS

The Johns Hopkins School of Public Health has requested the closure of the block of N Chapel St between McElderry St south to Jeferson St. Johns Hopkins has undertaken extensive development in the surrounding area in recent years, and the portion of N Chapel St in question is abutted by two other Hopkins properties which will be consolidated because of this closure. This ordinance would close the portion of N Chapel St between McElderry St and Jefferson St at the request of the Johns Hopkins School of Public Health. The closed alley will be consolidated into existing Johns Hopkins properties in Block 1649. The City will retain an easement for utilities which are not abandoned or relocated within the footprint of the closure. Johns Hopkins will pay for all costs and expenses in connection with this matter.

SUMMARY OF POSITION

The Department has determined that the requested closure will have little to no impact on traffic operations. Therefore, BCDOT respectfully requests a favorable report on Council Bill 25-0086.
