Position: Does Not Oppose

The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 21-001, Minority and Women’s Business Enterprise – Self-Performance, the purpose of which is to modify the applicable self-performance credit for minority women’s business enterprise prime contractors.

Background

Currently, Baltimore City allows certified Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women Business Enterprise (WBE) vendors that have been awarded a contract as a prime contractor to count up to 50% of the dollar value of work conducted by that vendor towards the applicable MBE/WBE contract goals.

This legislation enables the prime contractor to count 100% of the dollar value of work conducted by that vendor towards the applicable MBE/WBE contract goals.

Fiscal Impact Analysis

The Department of Finance does not anticipate a fiscal impact to the City from this bill.

Conclusion

This legislation increases the dollar value of work conducted by MBE/WBE prime contractors that can be counted towards the applicable MBE/WBE goals from 50% to 100%.

For the reasons stated above, the Department of Finance does not oppose City Council Bill 21-0061.
