SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the amounts set forth in Section 2 above designated deappropriations and enclosed in parentheses shall revert to the surpluses of the respective funds and be available for appropriation by this or subsequent ordinances.

#### 15 **SECTION 4.** AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

- (a) The City reasonably expects to reimburse the expenditures described in 16 Subsection (b) of this Section with the proceeds of one or more obligations (as such 17 term is used in Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-1(b) to be incurred by the City (or any entity 18 controlled by the City within the meaning of Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-1). The City 19 intends that this Section of this Ordinance of Estimates (as this Ordinance of 20 Estimates may be amended from time to time) shall serve as a declaration of the 21 City's reasonable intention to reimburse expenditures as required by Treas. Reg. 22 Section 1.150-2 and any successor regulation. 23
- (b) The City intends that this declaration will cover all reimbursement of expenditures for 24 capital projects or programs approved in the capital budget contained in this 25 Ordinance of Estimates to the extent that the City has appropriated in this Ordinance 26 of Estimates to pay the cost thereof from one or more obligations to be issued by the 27 28 City (or any entity controlled by the City within the meaning of Treas. Reg. 29 Section 1.150-1). The term "obligation" (as such term is defined in Treas. Reg. Section 1.150(b) and as used in this Section) includes general obligation bonds and 30 notes, revenue bonds and notes, leases, conditional purchase agreements and other 31 obligations of the City (or any entity controlled by the City within the meaning of 32 33 Treas. Reg. Section 1.150-1).
- (c) The maximum anticipated debt expected to be incurred by the City to reimburse the
   cost of each capital project or program in this Ordinance of Estimates is the applicable
   appropriation listed in this Ordinance of Estimates from the proceeds of one or more
   obligations, as such appropriations may be increased or decreased.
