The Baltimore City Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) at its December 14, 2021, hearing considered your application for designating the building 1220 E. Oliver Street (Oliver Community Firehouse) as a Historical Landmark.

The Commission, having reviewed the staff report and heard testimony, approved the following motion (10 members present; 7 members in support):

Approval of the Historical Landmark designation of 1220 E. Oliver Street (Oliver Community Firehouse).
