The Baltimore City Health Department (BCHD) is pleased to have the opportunity to review Council Resolution 12-0065R Informational Hearing – Mandatory Transportation for Drug Treatment Programs. The purpose of this bill is to request representatives from the City and State agencies that regulate and support chemical dependency treatment programs appear before the Council to discuss steps that can be taken to make treatment more accessible to residents of areas far from existing facilities while minimizing the impact of treatment facilities on their host neighborhoods, including the possibility of requiring facilities to provide transportation to their patients.

BCHD recognizes and appreciates that the needs of those individuals seeking treatment for substance abuse obtain services. Our goal is to ensure that everyone who needs treatment receives it. Unfortunately, we do not have the resources to provide transportation to the treatment facilities. Our limited resources are directed toward the treatment, and subsequent recovery of those seeking our assistance.
