I am herein reporting on City Council Bill No. 08-0126, introduced by Council President Rawlings Blake on behalf of the Administration (Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation).

The purpose of the Bill is to designate Castalia, 200 Tuscany Road, as a historical landmark.

Castalia is a large, single family building located in the Tuscany-Canterbury neighborhood and National Register historic district. It is owned by Calvert School. The structure was designed by Lawrence Hall Fowler who designed the War Memorial building, Garrett Library at Evergreen house, and many homes in Roland Park, Guilford, and Homeland.

The Department of Transportation defers to the Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation on City Council Bill 08-0126.
