 or private sale, all its interest in certain properties known as 916, 1016, and 1018 North
 Arlington Avenue and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective
 date.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in accordance with Article V, § 5(b) of the City Charter, the City Comptroller may sell, at either public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in the properties known as 916, 1016, and 1018 North Arlington Avenue, and more particularly described as follows:

- 17916 North Arlington Avenue (Block 0079, Lot 028), 1016 North Arlington18Avenue (Block 0066, Lot 042), and 1018 North Arlington Avenue (Block 0066,19Lot 041) are R-8 zoned sites, comprising $0.05 \pm acres$ (1800 square feet) and are20located in the Harlem Park Urban Renewal Area. The buildings on them were21constructed in 1900, and are currently vacant.
- 22 This property being no longer needed for public use.
- 23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance
 24 unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.
- 25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it 26 is enacted.
