## **Major Issues Discussed**

- 1. Chairwoman McCray discussed the impacts of COVID-19 on mental health and the importance of ensuring that residents have access to treatment and support.
- 2. Dr. Dzirasa presented on the Health Department's efforts to address the mental health impacts of the pandemic (presentation in file).
- 3. Adrienne Breidenstine and Kisha Winston-Watkins presented on Behavioral Health System Baltimore's (BHSB) services and response to the pandemic (presentation in file).
- 4. Katie Yorick presented on the pandemic's mental health impacts on individuals experiencing homelessness and the Mayor's Office of Homeless Services' (MOHS) efforts to address those impacts.
- 5. Lea Ferguson discussed the Mayor's Office of Children and Family Success' (MOCFS) response to the mental health impacts of the pandemic.
- 6. Tevis Simon discussed her experience as person with mental health diagnoses and as a mental health service provider during the pandemic.
- 7. Councilmembers asked the following questions:
  - a. What financial assistance or low cost mental health services are available for those who lost their health coverage during the pandemic? The Here2help hotline can connect them to services and they may be eligible for Medicaid.
  - b. Does the Mayor's Office of Homeless Services work with providers to connect people experiencing homelessness to tele-health resources? Yes, the Office works with partners through shelters.
  - c. How does the City help populations without access to technology connect with services? The Health Department staff are out in the field to connect older populations to service. The Department will follow up with additional information.
  - d. Does the City offer any online mental health assessments with provider follow-up? Currently BHSB offers assessments and referrals by phone, but is not aware of an online tool.
  - e. What mental health services will be incorporated into schools when they reopen? The school system is developing its own plans with some financial assistance coming from the federal and state governments. MOCFS has had some discussions with the school system and will send additional information on its plans.
  - f. What populations are most vulnerable and in need of mental health services? Older adults are particularly at risk and may have difficulty connecting to services through technology.
- 8. The Committee voted to recommend the resolution favorably.
