1	DISCLOSURE OF HEAVY- INDUSTRIAL AND RAILROAD OPERATIONS
2	BUYER IS ADVISED THAT THE PROPERTY MAY BE LOCATED NEAR HEAVY-
3	INDUSTRIAL OPERATIONS (THAT IS, LAND USES LIMITED TO AN M-3 INDUSTRIAL
4	ZONING DISTRICT UNDER ZONING CODE TITLE 7, SUBTITLE 4) OR NEAR RAILROAD
5	OPERATIONS.
6	THESE OPERATIONS MAY INVOLVE THE USE OF MACHINERY, TRUCKS, OR TRAINS,
7	24 HOURS A DAY, 7 DAYS A WEEK, AND MAY CREATE OR CAUSE NOISES, ODORS,
8	FUMES, BRIGHT LIGHTS, VIBRATIONS, AND SAFETY HAZARDS.
9	DETAILED INFORMATION ON THE LOCATION OF HEAVY-INDUSTRIAL (M-3) ZONES
10	AND ON THE LOCATION OF RAILROAD TRACKS CAN BE FOUND ON THE "BALTIMORE
11	CITYVIEW" WEBSITE, AT HTTP://CITYVIEW.BALTIMORECITY.GOV.
12	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That City Code Article 2, § 14-5(b), (c), and (d)
13	are relettered to be City Code Article 2, § 14-5(a), (b), and (c).
14	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That if any provision of this ordinance or
15	the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any
16	reason, the invalidity does not affect any other provision or any other application of this
17	Ordinance, and for this purpose the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.
18	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
19	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
20	Ordinance.
21	SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on October 1,
22	2012.
