## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning 2 City Streets – Closing – **Portland Street** 3 FOR the purpose of condemning and closing Portland Street, extending from Greene Street 4 Easterly 103.4 feet, more or less, to Washington Boulevard, as shown on Plat 348-A-85 in the 5 Office of the Department of Public Works; and providing for a special effective date. 6 7 By authority of Article I - General Provisions 8 Section 4 9 10 and Article II - General Powers 11 Sections 2, 34, 35 12 **Baltimore City Charter** 13 (1996 Edition) 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 15 Department of Public Works shall proceed to condemn and close Portland Street, extending from 16 Greene Street Easterly 103.4 feet, more or less, to Washington Boulevard, and more particularly 17 described as follows: 18 19 Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the east side of Greene Street, 66 feet wide, and the north side of Portland Street, 66 feet wide, 20 and running thence binding on the north side of said Portland Street, Easterly 21 103.4 feet, more or less, to intersect the northwest side of Washington Boulevard, 22 50 feet wide; thence binding on the northwest side of said Washington Boulevard, 23 24 Southwesterly 118.6 feet, more or less, to intersect the southwest side of said 25 Portland Street; thence binding on the southwest side of said Portland Street, Northwesterly by a line curving to the right with a radius of 3.00 feet the distance 26 of 6.5 feet, more or less, to intersect the east side of said Greene Street, and thence 27

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That the proceedings for the condemnation and closing of Portland Street and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and regulations adopted by the Director of Public Works and filed with the Department of Legislative Reference.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That after the closing under this Ordinance, all subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their use has been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or interfere with them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council and, in the application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every kind, arising out of the removal, alteration, or interference.
17 18 19 20 21	<b>SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That no building or structure of any kind (including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of the street closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City Council or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been removed and

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That at all times after the closing under this Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from or pay compensation to the owner of the property.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
