AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

1	Hotels – Human Trafficking Prevention
2	FOR the purpose of requiring the registration of all hotels in the City; prohibiting hotels from
3	renting out sleeping accommodations for a period of less than ½ day; requiring that all hotel
4	employees receive training in how to identify human trafficking activities and human
5	trafficking victims; requiring hotels to certify that all employees have been given anti-human
6	trafficking training; requiring the posting of a certain certificate; prohibiting the issuance of a
7	multiple-family dwelling or rooming house license to a hotel that is not in compliance with
8	the training and certification requirements of this ordinance; defining certain terms; providing
9	for certain penalties; and generally relating to the operation of hotels in Baltimore City.

21	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
22	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

1	§ 5-6. Prerequisites for license.
2	A license may be issued or renewed under this subtitle only if:
3 4	(1) all dwelling units are currently registered under Subtitle 4 ("Non-Owner-Occupied Dwellings; Vacant Structures") of this article;
5 6	(2) the registration fees and all outstanding interest and late fees required by Subtitle 4 have been paid;
7	(3) the premises have been inspected by the Commissioner;
8 9	(4) the premises are in compliance with State laws and regulations governing lead paint; and
10 11	(5) the premises are not subject to an unabated violation notice issued under § 116 {"Unsafe Structures"} of the Baltimore City Building Code; AND
12 13 14 15	(6) IF THE PREMISES INCLUDE A HOTEL SUBJECT TO SUBTITLE 10 {"HOTELS"} OF ARTICLE 15 {"LICENSING AND REGULATION"} OF THE BALTIMORE CITY CODE, THE HOTEL IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE TRAINING, CERTIFICATION, AND POSTING REQUIREMENTS OF THAT SUBTITLE.

18	§ 10-1. DEFINITIONS.
19	(A) IN GENERAL.
20	IN THIS SUBTITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.
21	(B) HUMAN TRAFFICKING.
22 23	"Human trafficking" means the use of force, threat of force, fraud, or coercion to:
24	(1) CAUSE AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER 18 TO ENGAGE IN A COMMERCIAL SEX ACT; OR
25 26	(2) RECRUIT, HARBOR, TRANSPORT, PROVIDE, OR OBTAIN ANY INDIVIDUAL FOR LABOR OR COMMERCIAL SEX.:
27 28 29	(1) SEX TRAFFICKING IN WHICH A COMMERCIAL SEX ACT IS INDUCED BY FORCE, FRAUD OR COERCION, OR IN WHICH THE PERSON INDUCED TO PERFORM SUCH ACT HAS NOT ATTAINED 18 YEARS OF AGE; OR
30 31	(2) THE RECRUITMENT, HARBORING, TRANSPORTATION, PROVISION, OR OBTAINING OF A PERSON FOR LABOR OR SERVICES, THROUGH THE USE OF FORCE, FRAUD, OR

1 2	COERCION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBJECTION TO INVOLUNTARY SERVITUDE, PEONAGE, DEBT BONDAGE, OR SLAVERY.
3	(C) Finance Housing Department; Department.
4 5	"Finance Housing Department" or "Department" means the Baltimore City Department of Finance Housing.
6	(D) HOTEL.
7 8 9	"HOTEL" MEANS A BUILDING ANY BUILDING, INCLUDING ANY MOTEL, CONTAINING SLEEPING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR MORE THAN 5 PERSONS AND OPEN TO THE TRANSIENT PUBLIC.
10	(E) PERSON.
1	"PERSON" MEANS:
12	(1) AN INDIVIDUAL;
13 14	(2) A PARTNERSHIP, FIRM, ASSOCIATION, CORPORATION, OR OTHER ENTITY OF ANY KIND; OR
15 16	(3) A RECEIVER, TRUSTEE, GUARDIAN, PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE, FIDUCIARY, OR REPRESENTATIVE OF ANY KIND.
17	§ 10-2. REGISTRATION REQUIRED.
18 19 20	No person may operate a hotel in Baltimore City without first registering the hotel with the Department of $\frac{\text{Finance}}{\text{Pousing}}$ on the form required by the Department.
21	§ 10-3. RULES, REGULATIONS, AND FORMS.
22	(A) DEPARTMENT TO ADOPT.
23 24	The $\frac{\text{Finance}}{\text{Housing}}$ Department must adopt rules, regulations, and forms to carry out this subtitle.
25	(B) FILING.
26 27 28	A COPY OF THE RULES, REGULATIONS, AND FORMS AND OF ANY AMENDMENTS TO THEM MUST BE FILED WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BEFORE THEY TAKE EFFECT.

1	§ 10-5. HOURLY RENTALS PROHIBITED.
2 3	No person who owns or operates a hotel within the City may rent out sleeping accommodations for a period of less than $\frac{1}{2}$ day.
4	§ 10-6. ANTI-TRAFFICKING TRAINING REQUIRED.
5	
6	(A) HOTEL EMPLOYEES TO BE TRAINED.
7	(1) ANY PERSON WHO OWNS OR OPERATES A HOTEL WITHIN THE CITY MUST PROVIDE
8	TRAINING TO ALL NEW HOTEL EMPLOYEES, WITHIN 30 DAYS OF HIRE, ON HOW TO
9	IDENTIFY HUMAN TRAFFICKING ACTIVITIES AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING VICTIMS.
10	(2) ANY PERSON WHO OWNS OR OPERATES A HOTEL WITHIN THE CITY MUST PROVIDE
11	TRAINING TO ALL EXISTING HOTEL EMPLOYEES ON HOW TO IDENTIFY HUMAN
12	TRAFFICKING ACTIVITIES AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING VICTIMS BY AUGUST 1 ST , 2016.
13	(B) <u>HEALTH COMMISSIONER APPROVED TRAINING</u> POLICE APPROVED VIDEO REQUIRED.
14	THE ANTI-TRAFFICKING TRAINING PROGRAM REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION MUST INCLUDE
15	VIEWING A TRAINING VIDEO BE APPROVED BY THE POLICE HEALTH COMMISSIONER AS
16	APPROPRIATE FOR TRAINING EMPLOYEES ON HOW TO IDENTIFY HUMAN TRAFFICKING
17	ACTIVITIES AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING VICTIMS.
18	(C) CERTIFICATION REQUIRED.
19	BEGINNING IN CALENDAR YEAR 2016, ANY PERSON WHO OWNS OR OPERATES A HOTEL
20	WITHIN THE CITY MUST ANNUALLY CERTIFY TO THE POLICE HOUSING COMMISSIONER, NO
21	LATER THAN AUGUST 1ST OF EACH YEAR, THAT ALL OF THEIR EMPLOYEES HAVE
22	COMPLETED THE TRAINING REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION.
23	§ 10-7. POSTING CERTIFICATION.
24	(A) IN GENERAL
25	AFTER THE ISSUANCE TO A HOTEL OF A MULTIPLE FAMILY DWELLING LICENSE REQUIRED
26	BY CITY CODE ARTICLE 13 ("HOUSING AND URBAN RENEWAL"), § 5-4 ("LICENSE
27	REQUIRED"}, THE HOTEL MUST PROMINENTLY DISPLAY A SIGN STATING THAT THE
28	FACILITY HAS PROVIDED TRAINING TO ALL EMPLOYEES ON HOW TO IDENTIFY HUMAN
29	TRAFFICKING ACTIVITIES AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING VICTIMS.
30	(B) MANNER OF DISPLAY.
31	THE SIGN REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION MUST BE PROMINENTLY
32	DISPLAYED IN THE LOBBY OF THE HOTEL IN THE FORM AND MANNER REQUIRED BY THE
33	DEPARTMENT.

1	§ 10-9. PENALTIES.
2	(A) IN GENERAL.
3 4 5 6 7	Any person who violates or who neglects or refuses to comply with any provision of this subtitle or of any rule or regulation adopted under this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine of not more than \$1000 or imprisonment for not more than 12 months or both fine and imprisonment.
8	(B) EACH DAY A SEPARATE OFFENSE.
9 10	EACH DAY THAT A VIOLATION CONTINUES AFTER NOTIFICATION CONSTITUTES A SEPARATE OFFENSE.
11 12 13	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
14 15	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
