Analysis

Current Law

Article 31 – Transit and Traffic, subtitle 20 of the Baltimore City Code governs and defines the residential permit parking program in Baltimore City

§10-19. Parking Management Plan - Amendment.

(a) By Ordinance

At any time after a Parking Management Plan has been adopted by administrative regulation, the Mayor and City Council may enact an Ordinance rescinding or modifying the administrative regulation and the Parking Management Plan created by it.

Background

Currently, the Parking Management Plan Restatement RPP Area 30 allows all dwelling units in this area to be eligible for up to 4 residential parking permits and 1 visitor pass. Council Bill 23-0441, which was brought forth by Chairman Costello via community input, will exclude the planned multi-family residential development on South Charles St. from eligibility for any residential parking permits and visitor passes.

The Law Department reviewed City Council Bill 23-0441 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill amends the Parking Management Plan Restatement for RPP Area 30 (South Baltimore East) to add an exception to the Plan's general permit allotments for dwelling units. The ordinance would take effect 30 days after the date it is enacted.

Baltimore City Code Article 31, § 10-19(a) provides as follows:

At any time after a Parking Management Plan has been adopted by administrative regulation, the Mayor and City Council may enact an Ordinance rescinding or modifying the administrative regulation and the Parking Management Plan created by it.

The Parking Management Plan for Area 30 (South Baltimore East) was adopted by administrative regulation and is in effect in Area 30. The City Council has the authority to modify the administrative regulation and the Parking Management Plan for Area 30-South Baltimore East.

The Law Department approves this bill for form and legal sufficiency.

I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 23-0441, introduced by Councilmember Costello.

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Parking Management Plan Restatement for Residential Permit Parking (RPP) Area 30 to exclude a planned multi-family development at 1600 South Charles St from participation in RPP Area 30.

The Parking Authority of Baltimore City (PABC) has reviewed the proposed legislation. Councilmember Costello brought forth the bill based on community input, in accordance with Baltimore City Code Article 31, section 10-19(a).

This bill will have minimal fiscal impact on PABC programs.

As this bill is in accordance with Article 31, the PABC respectfully requests a favorable report on City Council Bill 23-0441.
