1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 **General Fund Operating Appropriation Transfer –**
3 **General Fund Balance to**
4 **Health Department (Service 315 - Emergency Services) – \$5,251,429**

5 FOR the purpose of transferring a General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of
6 \$5,251,429 from the General Fund Balance to the Health Department (Service 315 -
7 Emergency Services); and providing for a special effective date.

13 **Recitals**

14 Article VI, § 9(a)(2) of the City Charter provides that, on recommendation of the Board of
15 Estimates, the City Council by ordinance may authorize the transfer of an appropriation
16 contained in the Ordinance of Estimates from one municipal agency to another municipal agency.

17 The sum of \$5,251,429, as appropriated to the General Fund Balance in the Fiscal 2024
18 Ordinance of Estimates, is not needed for the purpose for which it was appropriated and,
19 therefore, is available for transfer to another agency.

20 On February 5, 2025, the Board of Estimates recommended the transfer authorized by this
21 Ordinance.

22 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the
23 sum of \$5,251,429, contained in the Fiscal 2024 Ordinance of Estimates as a General Fund
24 Appropriation, is transferred from the General Fund Balance to the Health Department
25 (Service 315 - Emergency Medical Services).
