Residential Permit Parking Program Part V. Non-Resident Parking Restrictions § 10-28. [2-hour restriction] MAXIMUM PARKING DURATIONS. (a) In general.

Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, parking durations for non-permit holders

are limited to 2 hours.

6	(2) AREA 2 ("MORGAN").
7 8 9	In the Residential Parking Area known as Area 2 ("Morgan"), parking for non-permit holders is limited during any 1 calendar day to 1 hour in any 1 or more parking spots anywhere within the Residential Parking Area.
10 11 12	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
13 14	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
