> City Council Bill 08-0246 – Enticing Minors – Expanded Coverage Re:

Dear Madame President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 08-0246 for form and legal sufficiency. This bill would expand the existing prohibition in Section 38-1 of Article 19 of the City Code against enticing a child into a vehicle so that it applies to all minors under the age of 18, not just to children under the age of 14. It also increases the maximum fine to \$1,000 and the maximum jail time to one year.

In addition, the bill removes the affirmative defense of "special privilege," which was previously a term for when a person had 1) permission of a parent/guardian, 2) was acting in response to an emergency or 3) reasonably believed it was necessary to preserve the health, safety or welfare of the child. Instead, the bill lists these previously termed "special privileges" as exceptions. Confusingly, however, the bill creates "acting under special privilege" as a fourth and separate exception, when it used to exist only as a term to describe the other three exceptions. Although this superfluous language does not impact the legal sufficiency of the bill, the Law Department recommends striking it.

Since this bill is in accordance with Sections 27, 47 and 48 of Article II of the City Charter, the Law Department approves Council Bill 08-0246 for form and legal sufficiency.
