I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 12-0147, introduced by City Council member Reisinger at the request of 7-Eleven, Inc.

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the Urban Renewal Plan for Caton/95 to amend certain exhibits to reflect the change of zoning, upon approval by separate ordinance, for the property known as 3224-3226 Washington Boulevard; waiving certain content and procedural requirements; making the provisions of the Ordinance severable; providing for the application of this Ordinance in conjunction with certain other ordinances; and providing for a special effective date.

The Urban Renewal Plan for Caton/95 was originally approved by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore by Ordinance 81-399 and last amended by Ordinance 98-336.

The Baltimore City Parking Authority has reviewed the amendment to the Urban Renewal Plan for Caton/95 and determined that the amendment would have no negative impact on parking in that area. The Parking Authority would make our staff readily available to other City agencies and/or work-groups on any parking activity within this Urban Renewal Plan area.

Based on the above comments, the Baltimore City Parking Authority supports the passage of City Council Bill 12-0147.
